Continuing Education Information

West Virginia licensed Social Workers may earn up to 19.25 contact hours by attending workshops in each time period, two networking sessions, both plenary sessions, and the Annual Meeting. Hours earned by related professions or those from out-of-state will vary according to their CE regulations. Attendance is required to earn hours.

NASW, WV is a recognized provider of continuing education for Social Workers in WV and OH, the WV Cert. Board for Addiction Professionals and the WVU Nonprofit Management Certificate Program. NASW CE hours are generally accepted for social workers licensed in DC, MD, KY, PA and VA. Applications are in process for Licensed Nursing Home Administrators and Attorneys. Ethics Hours for WV "TL" Social Workers

WV Temporary License holders need 8 Social Work Ethics CE hours every 2 years. Two *Networking Sessions* and workshops A15, B13, B15, C12, D5, D11, F10, & F16 apply. To insure access for others take a few hours this year and come back next year to earn more.

Psychopathology Hours for WV LICSW Candidates

Independent Clinical Social Worker candidates may meet the psychopathology requirement through CE hours. Workshops A8, A11, B9, C5, C10, C16, F3, F6, & G2 apply to the requirement.
